RE: Committee Recommendations

The Legislation Committee met on September 10 and referred the following six items to the Commission.

1. Resolution No. 3974 - Plan for Special Language Services to Limited English Proficient Populations.

MTC's Plan for Special Language Services to Limited English Proficient (LEP) Populations details procedures MTC will take to assist persons with limited proficiency of the English language.

Committee Recommendation: Approve MTC's Plan for Special Language Services to Limited English Proficient (LEP) Populations; MTC Resolution No. 3974.

2. Countywide Vehicle Registration Fees

Seven Bay Area counties will seek voter approval in November to increase the vehicle registration fee by \$10 per year to fund transportation improvements within each county.

Committee Recommendation: Support the vehicle registration fee measures on the November 2010 ballot in the counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara and Sonoma.

3. Proposition 22

Proposition 22 seeks to protect local property tax and redevelopment funds, local transportation funds, and state funds dedicated to transportation and public transit from diversion or borrowing by the state for non-transportation purposes.

Committee Recommendation: Support Proposition 22

4. Proposition 23

Proposition 23 would suspend implementation of Assembly Bill 32 (Nuñez), California's Global Warming Solutions Act.

Committee Recommendation: Oppose Proposition 23

5. Proposition 25

Proposition 25 seeks to amend the state Constitution to lower the vote requirement necessary for the legislature to pass a budget bill from two-thirds to a majority.

Committee Recommendation: Support Proposition 25

6. Proposition 26

Proposition 26 seeks to broaden the definition of a state or local tax to include some charges that are now considered fees.

Committee Recommendation: Oppose Proposition 26
