AB 3	Miller R	Confidential Home Address	12/6/2010	Assembly	Requires a person who requests the confidentiality of his or her home address to provide the Department of Motor Vehicles with a current employment address for purposes of processing the service and collection of a traffic, parking, or toll road violation. Requires a person who has requested the confidentiality of his or her home address to notify the department of any change in his or her employment address within 10 days.	
AB 14	Wieckowski D	Redevelopment: Fremont Agency	12/6/2010	Assembly	Authorizes the Fremont Redevelopment Agency to adopt a redevelopment plan for a project area encompassing or surrounding the New United Motor Manufacturing, Inc. (NUMMI) automobile manufacturing plant and the Warm Springs Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) station. Sets forth alternative conditions that cause blight for the purpose of the adoption of this redevelopment plan. Provides that the redevelopment plan would not be required to demonstrate conformance with the community's general plan, but prohibits the agency from receiving or using tax increment funds from the project area until its legislative body determines that the redevelopment plan is consistent with the general plan.	
AB 16	Perea D	High-Speed Rail Authority	12/6/2010	Assembly	Requires the High-Speed Rail Authority to make every effort to purchase high-speed train rolling stock and related equipment that are manufactured in California, consistent with federal and state laws.	



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AB 31	Beall D	Land use: high-speed rail: local master plan	12/6/2010	Assembly	Establishes the High-Speed Rail Local Master Plan Pilot Program, applicable to specified cities and counties. Requires each of those jurisdictions to prepare and adopt, by ordinance, a master plan for development in the areas surrounding the high-speed rail system in each jurisdiction. Requires the master plan to include incentives for encouraging investment and coherent growth in the areas surrounding the high-speed rail system in each participating jurisdiction. Requires the participating jurisdictions to collaborate with the State Air Resources Board to develop incentives to encourage development while concurrently reducing greenhouse gas emissions, consistent with or pursuant to AB 32 (2006). Requires the master plan to be consistent with the jurisdiction's general plan and the regional sustainable communities strategy.	
AB 41	Hill D	Conflicts of interest: disqualification	12/6/2010	Assembly	Adds members of the High-Speed Rail Authority to those specified offices who must publicly identify a financial interest giving rise to a conflict of interest or potential conflict of interest, and recuse themselves accordingly.	
AB 58	Galgiani D	High-speed rail	12/6/2010	Assembly	Authorizes the Governor to appoint up to five deputy directors exempt from civil service who would serve at the pleasure of the executive director.	
AB 61	Jeffries R	Neighborhood electric vehicles	12/7/2010	Assembly	Authorizes the County of Riverside to establish a neighborhood electric vehicle (NEV) transportation plan for a plan area that may include any portion of the county or cities in the county that elect to be included in the plan. The bill would require the plan to be submitted to the department for review and approval. The bill would require a report to the Legislature by January 1, 2016, if the county adopts a plan. Contains sunset date of January 1, 2017.	



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AB 76	Harkey R	High-speed rail	12/22/2010	Assembly	Reduces the amount of general obligation debt authorized pursuant to the Safe, Reliable High-Speed Passenger Train Bond Act for the 21st Century to the amount contracted as of January 1, 2012.	
AB 133	Galgiani D	High-speed rail	1/12/2011	Assembly	Requires federal funds made available to the state for high-speed rail purposes under the above-referenced federal acts to be available, upon appropriation, for certain work on one or more specified rail corridors approved by the Federal Railroad Administration, in a manner consistent with certain provisions of, and subject to certain conditions of, the bond act.	
ABX1 8	Ma D	Transportation bond funds	12/6/2010	Assembly	Authorizes recipients of transit security funding for ferries from Proposition 1B (2006) four fiscal years with which to spend funds allocated prior to June 30, 2011. Urgency legislation.	
ACA 4	Blumenfield D	Local government financing: voter approval	12/6/2010	Assembly	Creates an additional exception to the 1% limit for a rate imposed by a city, county, city and county, or special district, as defined, to service bonded indebtedness incurred to fund specified public improvements and facilities, or buildings used primarily to provide sheriff, police, or fire protection services, that is approved by 55% of the voters of the city, county, city and county, or special district, as applicable.	
SB 22	La Malfa R	High-speed rail	12/6/2010	Senate	States the intent of the Legislature to reexamine the bond funding mechanism of the authority relative to the authority's high-speed rail project.	



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SB 28	Simitian D	Vehicles: electronic wireless communications devices: prohibitions	12/6/2010	Senate	Requires the department to include a test of the applicant's understanding of the distractions and dangers of handheld cell phone use and text messaging while operating a motor vehicle.	
SB 29	Simitian D	Vehicles: automated traffic enforcement systems	12/6/2010	Senate	Requires that, no later than January 1, 2013, those requirements include identifying the system by signs posted within 200 feet of an intersection where a system is operating. The bill would require, by January 1, 2013, the governmental agency that operates an automated traffic enforcement system to develop uniform guidelines for specified purposes and to establish procedures to ensure compliance with those guidelines. The bill would require the governmental agency to adopt a finding of fact establishing the need for the system at a specific location for reasons related to safety for those systems installed after January 1, 2012.	
SB 103	Liu D	State government: meetings: teleconferencing	1/12/2011	Senate	Urges a state body, to the extent legally or financially possible, to conduct teleconference meetings.
