RE: BATA Assumption of CEQA Lead Agency Designation for "The Bay Lights" Project

Based on staff's recommendation, the Committee has referred for approval to the Authority BATA's assumption of California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Lead Agency Designation for "The Bay Lights" Project, subject to the execution of an agreement between "Illuminate the Arts," the non-profit corporation sponsoring the project and BATA, consistent with this memorandum.

### **Background**

The Bay Lights Project is a privately-financed fine arts installation, which features 24,000 energy-efficient LED lights to be placed on the suspender cables of the northern-facing side of the Bay Bridge's West Spans. The lights will celebrate the 75th "Diamond" anniversary of the Bay Bridge. The white theme will also serve to introduce the aesthetic feel of the new East Span, slated to open in 2013. The Bay Lights Project is a temporary installation. The LEDs will first be illuminated to mark the Bay Bridge's 75th Anniversary and will stay in place through the opening of the new East Span in late 2013. This fine arts installation will provide an international focal point during the America's Cup races and festivities slated for the summer and fall of 2013. After 2013, the Bay Lights will be removed from the West Spans.


For the project to move forward, Illuminate the Arts must submit a Transportation Art Application ("TAA") to the California Department of Transportation, which triggers the Department's encroachment permit process. The San Francisco Department of Public Works will be serving as the lead agency for the TAA, reviewing and submitting the application and working with the Board of Supervisors to get a resolution of support. The TAA requires a CEQA determination, which calls for a public agency step in as CEQA Lead Agency to make the determination.

BATA received a letter from Caltrans, which is attached for your reference, indicating it will delegate CEQA Lead Agency status to BATA for this project. The Lead Agency is responsible for making decisions regarding the proper manner of complying with CEQA requirements for the project. As a condition to serving as CEQA Lead Agency, BATA would require an agreement with Illuminate the Arts, setting out the roles and responsibilities of the parties, including requiring Illuminate the Arts to indemnify BATA for all claims and liabilities arising out of the project and to provide insurance, a bond, or other assurance to demonstrate its financial capacity to carry out its obligations under the agreement.

The BATA Oversight Committee made a number of inquiries about the project, including asking about the possibility of making the display permanent. As currently envisioned however, the project is a temporary installation to last only until the end of 2013.

**Recommendation**

Staff recommends that the Authority approve BATA's assumption of CEQA Lead Agency status for "The Bay Lights" Project, subject to the Executive Director, or his designee, negotiating and entering into an agreement with Illuminate the Arts, setting out the roles and responsibilities of the parties, including requiring Illuminate the Arts to indemnify BATA for all claims and liabilities arising out of the project and to provide insurance, a bond, or other assurance to demonstrate its financial capacity to carry out its obligations under the agreement.

Thank you for your letter regarding the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) compliance process for The Bay Lights project. I have reviewed your request that the Department of Transportation (Department) delegate the role of CEQA Lead Agency responsibility for this project to the Bay Area Toll Authority (BATA).

I have determined that there is sufficient justification to delegate CEQA Lead since the organization sponsoring this project is a non-profit group and the project will be privately funded.

Under CEQA Lead Agency responsibility, BATA will assess the impacts of the project on the environment. The Department will retain a Responsible Agency role.
