The Bay Bridge East Span's opening will be one of the seminal events of 2013. The single largest public infrastructure project in California's history, the Bay Bridge project completion signals a historic moment for the Bay Area and the 280,000 motorists who travel daily across the Bridge. Connecting two of the largest and most important cities in the state of California, the Bay Bridge East Span opening provides an ideal backdrop for celebration of these two cities and what connects them.

The Bay Bridge Celebration will be a fully accessible event for all who wish to participate. Event organizers have included accessibility accommodations throughout all stages of the event experience. Measures will be taken to create a positive experience for disabled attendees at each program.

Bay Bridge Walk

There are specific shuttle loading areas at each of the three main shuttle bus depots: Lake Merritt, West Oakland and Oakland City Center/12th & 19th Street Stations. In addition to public transportation access via BART, there are also specific drop off zones set aside close to each

- Crowd control barriers will be placed to isolate work area from main circulation path
- The circulation route around the work site will be free of protruding objects

BRIDGE WALK – START / FINISH

- Specific ADA shuttle loading areas will be located at main shuttle bus depots at Oakland City Center, Lake Merritt and West Oakland BART stations
- Specific drop off zones will be set aside close to each ADA shuttle loading area



ACCESSIBILITY PLAN

BRIDGE WALK – START / FINISH

- ADA shuttle will deliver participants directly to the walk start line
- Specific pickup zones will be located at the Howard and Main Street finish line area in addition to the Embarcadero and Montgomery Street BART stations
- ADA relief shuttles will be available on course to deliver participants to the finish line area

BRIDGE WALK – ON COURSE SUPPORT

- Credential check chutes built wide enough to accommodate disabled participants
- Course plan free of any stairs or similar access impediments
- Specially-equipped relief shuttles provided for any disabled participants who need to assistance completing the walk course

- Crowd control barriers will be placed to isolate work area from main circulation path
- The circulation route around the work site will be free of protruding objects



ACCESSIBILITY PLAN

BRIDGE RUN – COURSE ACCESS

- Specific ADA drop off zone at the 12k start line shuttle loading area in Oakland City Center and at the 12k start line on Frontage Road
- Shuttles deliver participants directly to the 12K start line
- Participants may take BART back to the East Bay, or be picked up at specific ADA pickup zones at finish line
- ADA relief shuttles will be available on courses to deliver participants to the finish line area

- Crowd control barriers will be placed to isolate work area from main circulation path
- The circulation route around the work site will be free of protruding objects



ACCESSIBILITY PLAN

BRIDGE RIDE – COURSE ACCESS

- Disabled riders are welcome to participate in the Bridge Ride with a hand crank cycle or similar cycle; for safety reasons, wheelchairs alone will not be allowed in the Bike Ride
- Disabled participants will be encouraged to contact Bay Area Outreach & Recreation Program (borp.org) for training and access to hand crank cycles
- The course plan will feature a route free of any stairs or similar access impediments
- ADA drop-off and pickup zones will be located within close proximity to the ride start/finish



ACCESSIBILITY PLAN

BRIDGE RIDE – COURSE ACCESS

- Specially equipped shuttles/sag wagons will be made available for any disabled participants who need assistance completing the ride
- Event organizers will maintain accessible routes and directional signage to all restrooms, water stations, and ADA-compliant bus loading zones
- Credential check chutes will be wide enough to accommodate recumbent hand crank bike types





- Event organizers will maintain accessible routes and directional signage to all restrooms, water stations, and ADA-compliant loading zones
- ADA-compliant restrooms will be located at pre-ceremony and ceremony events
- Although no pets are allowed at ceremonies, service animals will be permitted



ACCESSIBILITY PLAN

BRIDGE CEREMONIES – ONSITE SERVICES AND AMENITIES

- Ceremony seating will include a reserved area at the front of the audience consisting of 4.5% of the total seating count
- An ASL interpreter will be provided for both live spoken presentations and video presentations at ceremony events; reserved seating area will have clear view of the ASL interpreter
- Any video presentation will be supported with closed-captioning services
