## Resolution Nos. 3889, Revised; 3890, Revised; and 3658, Revised

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**Subject:** Allocation of approximately \$3.1 million in RM2 Capital funds for the Vallejo Curtola Transit Center, and revisions to the RM2 Regional Express Bus North program of projects. Allocation of \$2.3 million in RM2 Capital funds for the I-880 North Safety Improvements project between 29th and 23rd Avenues in Oakland.

**Background:** These actions are subject to the approval of agenda item 3.a.i, which reassigns \$2 million from Vallejo Station (RM2 project #5) to the Vallejo Curtola Transit Center (part of RM2 project #17, Regional Express Bus North), and \$2.3 million in savings from the Express Bus South project (RM2 project #29) to the I-880 North Safety Improvements project (RM2 project #30).

**Vallejo Curtola Transit Center and Express Bus North:** Staff is proposing three actions related to these projects:

1. Allocation of approximately \$3.1 million to construct Phase 1A of the Vallejo Curtola Transit Center, which includes a civic transit plaza for pedestrian and bus traffic; grading, repaving, and restriping of the surface lot for maximum efficiency; median and utility improvements to Curtola Parkway; and on-site improvements to Carlson Street. This allocation will specifically help fund project elements including the canopy structure, site furniture, solar panels, and electric vehicle charging stations. The total project cost for Phase 1A is approximately \$14.8 million. The project received environmental clearance in 2012 and based on the current schedule, construction will begin in June 2014. SolTrans is the implementing agency for this project. (MTC Resolution No. 3889, Revised.)

2. Revision of the Express Bus North Program of Projects, to reflect the transfer of approximately \$1.1 million in RM2 Regional Express Bus North funds from the Macdonald Avenue Bus Stop Improvements project to the Vallejo Curtola Transit Center, and to reflect the transfer of approximately \$2.2 million from the Fairfield Transit Center and \$950,000 from the Vacaville Intermodal Station to the Fairfield/Vacaville Train Station. Transfers of funds within the Express Bus North program are not subject to public hearing, unlike the transfers to the train station. Except for the transfer from the Vacaville Intermodal Station, these funds were not previously allocated and do not require any rescission action. (MTC Resolution No. 3890, Revised.)

With the above actions, all funds programmed to the Vallejo Curtola Transit Center would be allocated.

3. Rescission of approximately \$950,000 in savings from the Vacaville Intermodal Station project under Express Bus North. Phase 1 of the project is complete, and as described in item 3.a.i., the savings from the project are proposed to be reassigned to the Fairfield/Vacaville Train Station (RM2 project #14). The proposed rescission would partially enact the fund transfer proposed in item 3.a.i and is subject to that item's approval. Two other rescissions for proposed RM2 fund transfers for the Fairfield/Vacaville Train

Station, from the Vacaville Intermodal Station and the Fairfield Transit Center, are proposed to take place via delegated authority action. The funds for the train station are expected to be allocated later in 2014 as construction bid documents are issued. (MTC Resolution No. 3889, Revised.)

**I-880 North Safety Improvements Project:** The Alameda County Transportation Commission (ACTC) requests allocation of \$2.3 million in RM2 funds to complete the right-of-way phase for the I-880 North Safety Improvements project in Oakland. Caltrans and ACTC have encountered cost increases in the right-of-way phase due to lengthy acquisition delays and complex utility relocations as a part of the project. The proposed allocation of \$2.3 million is expected to fully fund the cost increases in right-of-way. (MTC Resolution No. 3653, Revised.)

Construction is expected to begin on the project in summer 2014. The California Transportation Commission allocated complementary funding from the Proposition 1B Trade Corridor Improvement Fund (TCIF) in 2013.

**Issues:** These allocations and rescissions are subject to the approval of agenda item 3.a.i, which would reassign RM2 funds to be available for allocations.

**Recommendation:** Refer Resolution Nos. 3889, Revised; 3890, Revised; and 3658, Revised; to the Commission for approval.

This resolution was revised on June 24, 2009 to allocate \$1.75 million towards the construction of Phase 1 of the Vacaville Intermodal Station.

This resolution was revised on July 22, 2009 to allocate \$532,000 under Delegated Authority towards the construction of the Pacheco Transit Center.

This resolution was revised on September 23, 2009 to allocate \$500,000 towards the construction of the Diablo Valley Transit Center.

RESOLUTION No. 3889

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 66500 et seq., the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (“MTC”) is the regional transportation planning agency for the San Francisco Bay Area; and

WHEREAS, Streets and Highways Code Sections 30950 *et seq.* created the Bay Area Toll Authority (“BATA”) which is a public instrumentality governed by the same board as that governing MTC; and

WHEREAS, on March 2, 2004, voters approved Regional Measure 2, increasing the toll for all vehicles on the seven state-owned toll bridges in the San Francisco Bay Area by \$1.00, with this extra dollar funding various transportation projects within the region that have been determined to reduce congestion or to make improvements to travel in the toll bridge corridors, as identified in SB 916 (Chapter 715, Statutes of 2004), commonly referred as Regional Measure 2 (“RM2”); and

WHEREAS, RM2 establishes the Regional Traffic Relief Plan and lists specific capital projects and programs and transit operating assistance eligible to receive RM2 funding as identified in Streets and Highways Code Sections 30914(c) & (d); and

WHEREAS, RM2 assigns administrative duties and responsibilities for the implementation of the Regional Traffic Relief Plan to MTC; and

WHEREAS, BATA shall fund the projects of the Regional Traffic Relief Plan by transferring RM2 authorized funds to MTC; and

WHEREAS, MTC adopted policies and procedures for the implementation of the Regional Measure 2 Regional Traffic Relief Plan, which specifies the allocation criteria and project compliance requirements for RM 2 funding (MTC Resolution No. 3636); and

WHEREAS, the Regional Express Bus North project is identified as capital project number 17 under RM 2 and is eligible to receive RM 2 funding as identified in Streets and Highways Code Sections 30914(c); and

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Transportation Commission is the project sponsor for the Regional Express Bus North program and has approved the funding distribution of \$20 million in RM2 funding and implementing agencies for the eligible projects listed in Streets and Highway Code Section 30914(c)(6); and

WHEREAS, each implementing agency has submitted an Initial Project Report (“IPR”), as required pursuant to Streets and Highway Code Section 30914(e), to MTC for review and approval; and

WHEREAS, Attachment A to this resolution, attached hereto and incorporated herein as though set forth at length, lists the project and phase for which each implementing agency is requesting RM2 funding and the reimbursement schedule and amount recommended for allocation by MTC staff; and

WHEREAS, Attachment B to this resolution, attached hereto and incorporated herein as though set forth at length, lists the required project specific conditions which must be met prior to execution of the allocation and any reimbursement of RM2 funds; and

WHEREAS, Attachment C to this resolution, attached hereto and incorporated herein as though set forth at length, includes MTC staff’s review of each implementing agency’s Initial Project Report (IPR) for this project; and

WHEREAS, Attachment D attached hereto and incorporated herein as though set forth at length, lists the cash flow of RM2 funds and complementary funding for the deliverable/useable RM2 project segment; and

WHEREAS, the claimants to which funds are allocated under this resolution have certified that the projects and purposes listed and recorded in Attachment A are in compliance with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.), and with the State Environmental Impact Report Guidelines (14 California Code of Regulations Section 15000 et seq.); now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that MTC approves MTC staff's review of each implementing agencies' IPR for this project as set forth in Attachment C; and be it further

RESOLVED, that MTC approves the allocation and reimbursement of RM2 funds in accordance with the amount and reimbursement schedule for the phase, and activities as set forth in Attachment A; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the allocation and reimbursement of RM2 funds as set forth in Attachment A are conditioned upon each implementing agency complying with the provisions of the Regional Measure 2 Regional Traffic Relief Plan Policy and Procedures as set forth in length in MTC Resolution 3636; and be it further

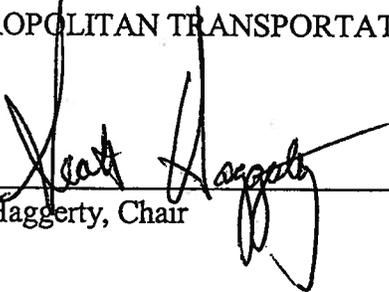
RESOLVED, that the allocation and reimbursement of RM2 funds are further conditioned upon the project specific conditions as set forth in Attachment B; and, be it further

It is estimated that up to 100 vehicles are parked on the adjacent streets on a typically day, bringing the total parking usage to 600 approximately vehicles per day. The lot is served by SolTrans, providing frequent service during commute periods. The proposed improvements include: Phase 1, upgrading the lot to a Transit Center, improving connections between local and regional express bus service, improving bus access and egress, upgrading roadway circulation in the immediate vicinity; and Phase 2, constructing a 3-4 level, 1200-space concrete parking structure on a portion of the existing park & ride lot, a net increase of 700 new parking spaces.

The construction is anticipated to occur in three major phases, with Phase 1 being split into sub-Phases 1A and 1B due to funding constraints. Operating Capacity: Upon project completion, SolTrans will assume responsibility for operating and maintaining the facility.

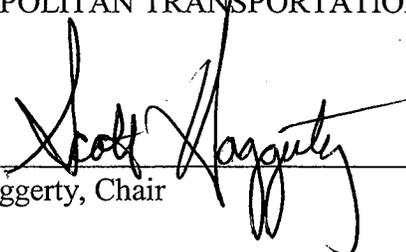
RESOLVED, that MTC approves MTC staff's review of the RM2 Regional Express Bus North Grant applications; and be it further

WHEREAS, BATA shall fund the projects of the Regional Traffic Relief Plan by transferring RM2 authorized funds to MTC; and

WHEREAS, MTC adopted policies and procedures for the implementation of the Regional Measure 2 Regional Traffic Relief Plan on June 23, 2004, specifying the allocation criteria and project compliance requirements for RM 2 funding (MTC Resolution No. 3636); and

WHEREAS, the Alameda County Congestion Management Agency has submitted a request for the allocation of RM 2 funds for the I-880 North Safety Improvements project; and
