MTC Resolution Nos. 3889, Revised and 3890, Revised

Subject: Allocation of \$1.6 million in Regional Measure 2 (RM2) Capital funds to the Golden Gate Bridge, Highway and Transportation District for the purchase of replacement buses for Golden Gate Transit, and revisions to the RM2 Regional Express Bus North program of projects.

Background: Staff is proposing two actions related to this project:

1. Allocation of \$1.6 million in RM2 capital funds to Golden Gate Bridge, Highway and Transportation District for the purchase of replacement buses. This allocation would be part of the Express Bus North program, which has approximately \$18.8 million in total funding after the Commission's May 2014 RM2 changes. Golden Gate's replacement bus purchase will total 25 buses for a cost of \$17.3 million, with RM2 funds matching federal and state funds. The purchase contract will be executed this month, with buses expected to be delivered in early 2015. (MTC Resolution No. 3889, Revised.)
2. Revision of the Express Bus North Program of Projects, to reflect the programming of \$1.6 million in RM2 Regional Express Bus North funds to Golden Gate Transit. (MTC Resolution No. 3890, Revised.)

This resolution approves the allocation of Regional Measure 2 funds for the Regional Express Bus North project sponsored by MTC and implemented by Golden Gate Bridge Highway and Transportation District, Vallejo Transit, Napa VINE, Fairfield-Suisun Transit, Western Contra Costa Transit Authority, Eastern Contra Costa Transit Authority, and Central Contra Costa Transit Authority.

This resolution was revised on June 24, 2009 to allocate \$1.75 million towards the construction of Phase 1 of the Vacaville Intermodal Station.

This resolution was revised on July 22, 2009 to allocate \$532,000 under Delegated Authority towards the construction of the Pacheco Transit Center.

This resolution was revised on September 23, 2009 to allocate \$500,000 towards the construction of the Diablo Valley Transit Center.

This resolution was revised on December 15, 2010 to allocate \$2.4 million to the Napa County Transportation and Planning Agency (NCTPA) towards right-of-way and construction activities for the NCTPA Multi-modal Transit Center Terminal/Park and Ride project.

This resolution was revised on March 28, 2012 to allocate \$200,000 to the Napa County Transportation & Planning Agency towards land acquisition and improvements for a park and ride lot in the town of Yountville in Napa County, California.

This resolution was revised on July 24, 2013 to allocate \$135,000 to the City of Benicia towards the Environmental and Preliminary Engineering phase of the Benicia Industrial Park Bus Hub project.

This resolution was revised on September 25, 2013 via Delegated Authority to allocate \$507,000 to the Central Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCCTA) to complete the construction of the Pacheco Transit Center.

This resolution was revised on November 20, 2013 via Delegated Authority to allocate \$170,000 to the City of Benicia towards the Plans, Specifications, and Estimate phase of the Benicia Industrial Park Bus Hub project.

This resolution was revised on March 26, 2014 to allocate \$5,750,000 to SolTrans toward construction for the Vallejo Curtola Transit Center.

This resolution was revised on May 28, 2014 to allocate \$3,061,000 to SolTrans toward construction for the Vallejo Curtola Transit Center, and to rescind \$951,548 in project savings from the Vacaville Intermodal Station.

This resolution was revised on June 25, 2014 to allocate \$1,600,000 to Golden Gate Bridge, Highway and Transportation District toward the purchase of replacement buses.

RESOLUTION No. 3889

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 66500 et seq., the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (“MTC”) is the regional transportation planning agency for the San Francisco Bay Area; and

WHEREAS, Streets and Highways Code Sections 30950 *et seq.* created the Bay Area Toll Authority (“BATA”) which is a public instrumentality governed by the same board as that governing MTC; and

WHEREAS, on March 2, 2004, voters approved Regional Measure 2, increasing the toll for all vehicles on the seven state-owned toll bridges in the San Francisco Bay Area by \$1.00, with this extra dollar funding various transportation projects within the region that have been determined to reduce congestion or to make improvements to travel in the toll bridge corridors, as identified in SB 916 (Chapter 715, Statutes of 2004), commonly referred as Regional Measure 2 (“RM2”); and

WHEREAS, RM2 establishes the Regional Traffic Relief Plan and lists specific capital projects and programs and transit operating assistance eligible to receive RM2 funding as identified in Streets and Highways Code Sections 30914(c) & (d); and

WHEREAS, RM2 assigns administrative duties and responsibilities for the implementation of the Regional Traffic Relief Plan to MTC; and

WHEREAS, BATA shall fund the projects of the Regional Traffic Relief Plan by transferring RM2 authorized funds to MTC; and

WHEREAS, MTC adopted policies and procedures for the implementation of the Regional Measure 2 Regional Traffic Relief Plan, which specifies the allocation criteria and project compliance requirements for RM 2 funding (MTC Resolution No. 3636); and

WHEREAS, the Regional Express Bus North project is identified as capital project number 17 under RM 2 and is eligible to receive RM 2 funding as identified in Streets and Highways Code Sections 30914(c); and

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Transportation Commission is the project sponsor for the Regional Express Bus North program and has approved the funding distribution of \$20 million in RM2 funding and implementing agencies for the eligible projects listed in Streets and Highway Code Section 30914(c)(6); and

WHEREAS, each implementing agency has submitted an Initial Project Report (“IPR”), as required pursuant to Streets and Highway Code Section 30914(e), to MTC for review and approval; and

WHEREAS, Attachment A to this resolution, attached hereto and incorporated herein as though set forth at length, lists the project and phase for which each implementing agency is requesting RM2 funding and the reimbursement schedule and amount recommended for allocation by MTC staff; and

WHEREAS, Attachment B to this resolution, attached hereto and incorporated herein as though set forth at length, lists the required project specific conditions which must be met prior to execution of the allocation and any reimbursement of RM2 funds; and

WHEREAS, Attachment C to this resolution, attached hereto and incorporated herein as though set forth at length, includes MTC staff’s review of each implementing agency’s Initial Project Report (IPR) for this project; and

WHEREAS, Attachment D attached hereto and incorporated herein as though set forth at length, lists the cash flow of RM2 funds and complementary funding for the deliverable/useable RM2 project segment; and

WHEREAS, the claimants to which funds are allocated under this resolution have certified that the projects and purposes listed and recorded in Attachment A are in compliance with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.), and with the State Environmental Impact Report Guidelines (14 California Code of Regulations Section 15000 et seq.); now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that MTC approves MTC staff's review of each implementing agencies' IPR for this project as set forth in Attachment C; and be it further

RESOLVED, that MTC approves the allocation and reimbursement of RM2 funds in accordance with the amount and reimbursement schedule for the phase, and activities as set forth in Attachment A; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the allocation and reimbursement of RM2 funds as set forth in Attachment A are conditioned upon each implementing agency complying with the provisions of the Regional Measure 2 Regional Traffic Relief Plan Policy and Procedures as set forth in length in MTC Resolution 3636; and be it further

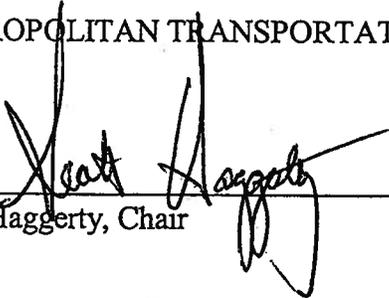
RESOLVED, that the allocation and reimbursement of RM2 funds are further conditioned upon the project specific conditions as set forth in Attachment B; and, be it further

WHEREAS, MTC used the process and criteria set forth in the March 4, 2009, RM2 Memo to develop the grant recipient list and the associated funding amounts found in Attachment A; and

WHEREAS, Attachment A to this resolution, attached hereto and incorporated herein as though set forth at length, lists the recommended grant recipients and the correlated funding amounts; therefore be it

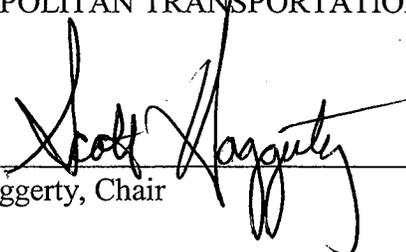
RESOLVED, that MTC approves MTC staff's review of the RM2 Regional Express Bus North Grant applications; and be it further

RESOLVED, that encumbrance of the Regional Express Bus North grants require a subsequent action, whereby MTC allocates the RM2 funds specific to each grant recipient consistent with the provisions of the Regional Measure 2 Regional Traffic Relief Plan Policy and Procedures as set forth at length in MTC Resolution 3636; and be it further

RESOLVED, that redistributing of any funds within the Regional Express Bus North Grant Program as a result of grant recipient non-compliance with the RM2 Policies and Procedures will be subject to MTC review and discretion.
