Legislation Committee

Minutes

Attendance

Committee Chair Haggerty called the Legislation Committee meeting to order at 11:27 a.m. Committee members in attendance were Vice Chair Liccardo, Commissioners Luce, Mackenzie and Spering. Also in attendance as an Ex-Officio voting member was Commission Chair Rein Worth. Present as ad hoc non-voting members of the Committee were Commissioners Bates, Campos and Tissier.

Consent Calendar

The consent calendar items 2a and 2c were unanimously approved after a motion by Commissioner Liccardo and a second by Commissioner Luce.

Randy Rentschler, MTC Director, provided a summary of item 2b FY 2014-15 State Budget Update.

AB 1646 (Frazier): Vehicles: Electronic Wireless Communication Devices: Prohibitions

Rebecca Long, MTC staff, presented AB 1646 (Frazier), which would raise the fines for driving while operating a cell phone without operating it in a hand-free mode or driving while sending or reading text messages to \$50 for a first offense and \$100 for a second offense.

Commissioner Liccardo moved to support AB 1646 (Frazier). Commissioner Spering seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved and moved to the Commission for approval.

AB 2565 (Muratsuchi): Rental Property: Electric Vehicle Charging Stations

Ms. Long presented AB 2565 (Muratsuchi), which would make it easier for residential or commercial tenants to own or lease an electric vehicle (EV) by voiding the terms of a lease executed, renewed, or extended after January 1, 2015 that prohibits or unreasonably restricts the installation of an EV charging facility in the parking lot connected to the renter's apartment at the renter's expense.

Commissioner Liccardo moved to support AB 2565 (Muratsuchi). Commissioner Mackenzie seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved and moved to the Commission for approval.

AB 2197 (Mullin): Temporary License Program Update

Ms. Long presented an update to AB 2197 (Mullin), which was held in the Assembly Appropriations Committee due to concerns about the state cost and implementation challenges. The bill is now dead, having missed the deadline to get out of the house of origin. Commissioner Haggerty questioned the opposition to this bill as the idea has been successful in many other states. Ms. Long informed the Committee that MTC will continue to push for a temporary license plate program.

S. 2322 (Boxer): MAP 21 Reauthorization Act

The Committee received information on S. 2322 (Boxer): MAP 21 Reauthorization Act from Mr. Rentschler. The bill authorizes \$262 billion in mandatory contract authority for the federal highway program for six years, from FY 2015 through FY 2020, a 1.9 percent annual increase in highway spending.

Tom Bulger's Report

The Committee received the report as presented by Mr. Rentschler.

Other Business/Public Comment/Adjourn
