The following item was in the July 2014 Executive Director's Report to the Commission:

- ***Olympic Transportation Meeting – Oakland, July 22***  
MTC hosted an exploratory meeting with the region's leaders from all transportation modes to discuss various mobility alternatives in support of a potential bid by the City and County of San Francisco to be the U.S. candidate city to host the 2024 Summer Olympic Games. The United States Olympic Committee (USOC) is discussing a possible U.S. candidacy with four cities: San Francisco, Los Angeles, Boston, and Washington, D.C. The USOC is expected to decide whether to advance a U.S. candidate by the end of the year.
